TURNING MOURNING & GRIEF INTO THE JOY OF THE LORD

TRAGEDY IS BUT A MOMENT AWAY FROM ALL OF US. ON A LATE AFTERNOON ON JUNE 26, 1995, IT VISITED OUR FAMILY. ON THAT DATE, NEAR ALPINE, ALABAMA, A TRAIN STRUCK THE CAR THAT OUR DAUGHTER, AMELIA, AND THREE OTHER YMCA CAMP COSBY COUNSELORS WERE RIDING IN. ALL FOUR CHILDREN DIED INSTANTLY.

When we received the news, the three Elliott girls who grew up at Vestavia Hills Baptist became two, and our family was devastated. In the midst of the long journey of grief that we embarked on, we asked God, "Why?" Why did He allow these precious children to be taken in the prime of their lives? I was angry. I wanted answers, but it didn't seem there were any. As a family we hurt so badly. A hole had been ripped in our hearts, seemingly never to be repaired.



God's answers don't always come when we want them to, but a few years later we discovered what His plan was. In January 1997, our church held a grief support group with speakers from Children's of Alabama. Jerrie and I attended the night that Reverend Joe McNulty, the hospital's Director of Pastoral Care, was the speaker. We did not know Joe, nor did he know us and that we were in the audience.

Amazingly, Joe began his discussion with the fact that on June 26, following the car accident that killed Amelia and her friends, the CEO of the Birmingham YMCA called Jim Dearth, the CEO of Children's at the time and asked that he provide someone to go to Camp Cosby to counsel with the staff and campers. Joe was the one elected to go. He spent several days at Camp Cosby helping out. From his experiences there, Joe was convinced that Birmingham needed a grief assistance center specifically for children and their families. In the year following the tragedy, Joe traveled to Portland. Oregon to The Dougy Center for Grieving Children & Families to be trained by the staff there.



That night Jerrie and I listened intently to Joe and his dreams. It was apparent to us that God had selected Joe to be there that night, and that the three of us were to meet. After he had concluded his remarks, we went up and introduced ourselves as Amelia's parents. He was surprised that we were there and also concerned that he may have hurt us by causing us to relive the tragedy again. We assured him that he had not, and that if he wanted to pursue establishing a grief center, then "let's do it."

And happen they did, rather quickly actually. Joe and I met several times with Jim Dearth, who thought establishing a grief center for children was something that would complement and enhance Children's mission to improve the physical and mental health of children. So, he asked us to make the presentation to the Children's Board of Directors, many of whom I already knew because of my community relations work with Bellsouth.

We made that presentation jointly and with it, it seemed, God's hand leading the way, the Board did approve the establishment of a grief assistance center as one of Children's offerings to the Greater Birmingham community. At the time of their decision, it wasn't called The Amelia Center. That came later when Jim Dearth asked if we would like it to be called The Amelia Center in honor of our daughter. We were overjoyed and soon the Center opened July 1997 with Reverend Joe McNulty as its first Executive Director. The symbol of the Center was to be a sunflower, Amelia's favorite flower. The motto was to be "a place of hope for grieving children and their families."



In the days to follow, the fine folks of Vestavia Hills Baptist Church began to help The Amelia Center. The Center's office was painted a drab gray, not a color to soothe a hurting child. Members of our Couples Sunday School class, wearing old clothes and wielding paint brushes, changed the Center's walls into a place of bright colors and comfort. Other church members donated hundreds of stuffed animals.

Many gave direct donations to the Center or to The Amelia Center Scholarship Fund, which had been set up at the church. Others prayed for its success. Merryl Cooper organized successful pancake suppers to benefit the Center. Perhaps, even more importantly, our church lifted our family up regularly in their prayers and supported us in so many ways. The church was Amelia's village, where you helped raise her and still remember her smiling face and laughter.



Now, 25 years later, **The Amelia Center**, with its five full-time counselors and two interns, all wonderfully talented and compassionate in what they do, have brought hope again to over 20,000 individuals. They have trained school counselors and professionals such as clergy and first responders in positive ways to deal with grieving people. Each Spring, at least before Covid, they sponsor an educational seminar, featuring nationally known experts on grief. Each December, the Center hosts a candlelight vigil on National Children's Memorial Day, a time when the children who've died the previous year or before have their names read and photographs shown, and each child is remembered.

Often we come into contact with individuals who have lost a child, and they say "We wouldn't be here today if it wasn't for The Amelia Center. Or there's the young lady who came to the Center, after suffering a miscarriage, who saw Amelia's picture on the wall in the lobby and said, "Oh, my God, that's Amelia Elliott. She was my counselor at Camp Cosby, and she told me, 'If you ever need me, I'll be there'... and she was." One of Amelia's best friends has said, "The establishment of The Amelia Center is the epitome of turning our mourning and grief into the joy of the Lord. He has blessed the Center and it's been used in countless ways to help and heal the families of our city and our state. So it has, and so it will continue to do so.

We are often credited with starting the Center. That's not so. We believe that God, while weeping over Amelia and the other counselors' deaths, put into motion all the parties who had an interest in helping grieving children and led them to establish a special place that would bring joy out of sorrow. He has stood in the midst of our tragedy, and He stands in the midst of yours. He wants us to make good overcome sorrow, and if we listen, will show us how.


We are grateful that we can be a part of this ministry to others. The Center is Amelia's legacy, and we are proud of it. Her spirit lives on in the midst of her tragic death. At Camp Cosby, there is an outdoor chapel dedicated to the four counselors who died. It's called the G.R.A.C.E. Chapel - **G**inger, **R**obin, **A**melia, **C**hris, **E**TERNITY, a fitting tribute. Likewise, The Amelia Center is a tribute, too - to making good things come out of bad situations.

TRAGEDY IS JUST A MOMENT AWAY FROM ALL OF US, AND YES, WE WILL GRIEVE AND HURT TERRIBLY. BUT, IF WE LISTEN CLOSELY GOD WILL LEAD US TO NEW WAYS OF MAKING JOY COME IN THE MORNING.
