# CHRISTMAS TRADITIONS

like a child anxious for **Chies** mas morning, I find myself great with anticipation for the upcoming worship celebrations at Vestavia Hills Baptist Church. Over our years of ministry, I have experienced many varied and wonderful Christmas traditions and experiences around the Southeast.

In Gatlinburg, we experienced our first white Christmas with snow falling on Christmas Eve. Our ministry focused on the ski community so we filled the days between Christmas and New Year's Day with work, tourist engagement, and connections with employees.

In coastal Beaufort, South Carolina, we celebrated Christmas Eve in a sanctuary built in 1844 surrounded by hundreds of candles as we sang Silent Night. The year Christmas fell on Sunday, our oldest daughter surprised us by coming forward to commit her life to Jesus, the baby in the manger.

In mountainous Cornelia, Georgia I spent my first Christmas trying to decide whether we needed to cancel the next day's worship service because of snow. Snow stopped in-person worship, but we enjoyed a great time of sledding with our neighborhood friends.

In warm Gainesville, Florida the community gathered at First Baptist Church to celebrate Christmas Eve. It was one of our largest services of the year followed by warm hot chocolate and cookies as families took pictures beside the large Christmas tree before heading home.

Every church and community have their own Christmas traditions built around their history, climate, and community. This year, I look forward to leading and experiencing our Christmas Eve and Christmas Day celebrations.

On Christmas Eve, our families with young children are invited to come at 4:30 pm for our Come See the Baby interactive service in the Fellowship Hall. Our children will participate in the Christmas story as we listen to God's good news of Jesus being born. Costumes and glow sticks make this service extra special. Children, their parents, and their grandparents are all invited to join us.

At 8:00 pm on Christmas Eve we will gather in our sanctuary for a traditional Candlelight Christmas Eve Service. The handbell choir will lead us as we sing carols, light the Christ candle, celebrate communion, and sing Silent Night. This service will give us the feel of a midnight Christmas Eve service while getting us home just in time for Santa.

This year Christmas falls on Sunday. On Sunday, December 25, we will gather for a casual time of worship at 10 am. Children are invited to wear their pajamas. We will sing carols, hear Christmas stories, and celebrate the birth of Jesus together. I hope you will make time after breakfast on Christmas Day to come worship with your family.

Most of all, this Christmas I am excited to be with you as your pastor. While everything feels new, I am thankful to experience our traditions and celebrate Jesus together. I'll see you this Sunday. You are loved.




