

THE ANTICIPATION OF CHRISTNAS

Advent is a spiritual exercise of waiting.

During these four weeks of waiting for Christmas, we are reminded waiting is an element of everyday life. Waiting is built into the Christian experience as we wait for the return of Christ. Yet, waiting is difficult for some of us. During Advent we elevate and practice waiting so God may develop patience in our lives.

I have a waiting deficiency. Waiting and patience do <u>not</u> come naturally to me.

In November 1982, I was 13 years old when my family traveled to the Georgia Baptist Convention. I stayed with a friend's family while they traveled. Each afternoon after school, the school bus dropped me off at my house and I waited until my friend's parents picked me up after work.

One afternoon that week, while I was waiting, I heard a knock on the door.

I peered out the front window. A UPS delivery man stood on the porch with a large box. When I opened the door, he asked me to sign for the package. I brought the big, cardboard box into the house, examining it closely. The label said JCPenney. Intrigued, I debated with myself whether to open the box. With a clear waiting deficiency, I tore it open.



Inside, I discovered the most beautiful department store stereo with a record player, an 8-track tape player, and one of those new cassette players. I had just opened **MY** Christmas gift in November.

Once again, I was overwhelmed by waiting. Nothing inside me told me to re-tape the box and act innocently when my parents returned. Definitely not. Instead I hauled my new stereo out of its box, rearranged my furniture, and set up the best stereo technology had to offer in 1982. By the time my friend's parents came to pick me up that day, I was blasting the radio for the whole neighborhood to hear...primarily because I had no records or tapes!

When my mom and dad returned home, they were disappointed. So, they decided to teach me a lesson and included my innocent sister. Since I opened my Christmas gift early, they decided my sister and I would open all of our presents early. Each day leading up to Christmas my sister and I opened a gift. By Christmas morning, there were no gifts left to open. I still remember the empty feeling I had looking at the Christmas tree with no presents.

I missed something important. My actions wiped away the anticipation of Christmas.

We all have a bit of waiting deficiency in us - wanting Christmas or the return of Jesus to arrive sooner rather than later. We want what we want **now**. We forget God is at work - slowing things down - giving us more time to allow His own purposes to be lived out in our lives.

As we wait these final weeks for the arrival of Christmas, take a moment to give thanks to God for what He is producing in us in our waiting. Then, on Christmas Day, join me in celebrating the arrival of Christ the King. The waiting is worth it!
