

NO <u>one</u> person can care for the children of a church

Ms. Nancy has been the Children's Minister at VHBC since January 2, 1990.

When given the opportunity to write an article for the church newsletter, what does any children's minister, worth their weight in salt, offer?

Volunteers, of course!

A children's minister eats, breathes, and sleeps recruitment. Why? Because no <u>one</u> person can care for and teach the children at church.

Even when it appears every position is covered and every class has teachers, recruitment continues—for the new class, for the next class, for the summer, for the fall. Recruitment is always spinning around in this children's minister's mind. Always.

The children and families in our church need every adult to participate in children's ministry. Here are ways you can be a part.

BE AWARE.

Be aware of families with young children AND take the extra step of introducing yourself! "Hi! My name is Nancy Akins. Please remind me of your name" or "Hi! My name is Nancy Akins. I don't think we have had the opportunity to meet." As you meet children, say their names aloud. Intentionally meet families on Sunday mornings. Be the person who meets a family in the hallway and then invites them to sit with you in worship!

SIT WITH A FAMILY FOR WEDNESDAY NIGHT DINNER.

This one takes a little courage, doesn't it?! It's normal and easy to sit with people we know, people who know us, but what about taking one Wednesday night a month to sit with someone else? This practice could be life giving to our congregation.

VOLUNTEER IN WORSHIP CARE.

"Tve already done my time." A common response by all of us. But if our church wants to welcome young families, we all need to consider serving in Worship Care, even parents! Worship Care is the care of babies through kindergarteners during Sunday morning worship. Volunteers can serve once a month (just six times a year!), once every other month, or every fifth Sunday. Working in Worship Care is a WONDERFUL opportunity to get to know young families in our church!



Since its adoption by the church, over 130 families have made gifts to the PEF. Because of the very capable guidance of our PEF Committee, the PEF Investment Committee, our Pastor, Administrative Pastor, and our ministry partners at the WMU Foundation, the fund ended the 2022 year with over \$724,000 in assets.

Since 2018, the PEF has made grants of over \$91,000. During the month of February, the PEF Committee is receiving requests for grants from staff members, organization heads, and committee chairs. The deadline for grant requests is Sunday, March 5. The grants will be presented during the worship service on Anniversary Sunday, May 7.

Janet is a retired school librarian and Ronnie is retired after a career as a campus minister and pastor, mostly in Tuscaloosa and Huntsville.


