

THE WORK OF THE PEOPLE

I remember when my vision of worship expanded.

In the 2000's I attended a faith formation conference and heard the words "Worshipful Work" for the first time. Building off the work of Charles Olsen in Transforming Church Boards into Communities of Spiritual Leaders, the leaders challenged us to envision the work of the church (administrative committees, business meetings, etc.) as worship. In worshipful work, these important church functions become extensions of the liturgy in the sanctuary. Worship expanded for me beyond a sanctuary and a tv screen.

During this season of my ministry, I also realized the word liturgy means "the work of the people." While we often use the word liturgy to describe the form of our public worship of God, liturgy is expansive. God desires more from us than showing up to observe what takes place on a platform. God want us to offer our whole as living sacrifices – this is our "true and proper worship" (Romans 12:1 NIV). Worship invites our full participation – not only when we gather.

Søren Kierkegaard, a Danish Christian thinker and writer who lived in the 1800s, described this same understanding of worship when he compared worship to a play in his book Purity of Heart. Kierkegaard complains that too often we imagine the minister is the star actor or actress in a play, with the choir and musicians in supporting roles and the congregation in the audience. In fact, he concludes, the congregation is on the center stage doing the work while the minister and choir coach (prompt) us to do our best for God, who is the audience. Our lives become liturgy as we live for an audience of One.

This expanded philosophy of worship extends to my role as preacher in our community of faith. I attempt to release the Living Word of God into our lives for the sake of the world each week through my preaching.

As we sing, pray, read scripture, confess, and listen – we are responding with our lives – doing the work of the people.

This Advent Season we are focused on Worship Anew. Let me invite you to expand your vision of worship.
Throughout the month you will find daily worship prompts in the Journey to Bethlehem Advent Worship Guide.

These prompts invite you to engage with a Christmas carol, pray a breath prayer, reflect on a scripture, practice new disciplines, and participate in God's Kingdom. These prompts offer you the opportunity to do the work of the people each day.




