## Lessons of a Health Crisis

How are Christians to respond in the face of a possible pandemic? The book of James chapter 5 can help us. The Coronavirus threat is causing anxiety with questions looming about how our schools, places of work, and worship will be impacted. There are genuine concerns, realistic things we should do, and preparations to be made. See our staff statement on page 3.

But also note in James --- it is the community that is the healing channel. The elders are summoned to pray AND anoint the person with oil. I understand this to mean use BOTH prayer and medical treatment, which anointing was in that day. One thing is clear: they *touched* the person who was ill.

We literally *lose touch* with people who are sick. Sometimes individuals must be isolated because of contagious disease, but their need for human contact remains. One of the killing dimensions of illness beyond the disease itself is that it spiritually, emotionally, and physically isolates us from others. The loneliness and rejection many feel contribute to their crisis and the struggle to return to health. One of the healing antidotes we have to give is our presence with one another. To those isolated by illness, the Christian community is called to minister and extend care.

Finally, the Church ought to be about the ministry of healing. Of course, there is an embarrassed silence about all of this. The secularization of medicine has forever removed the healing ministry of the church to the periphery. We are somewhat ashamed of the whole sorry mess. It reappears in churches that place practical and science-based healthcare below a kind of magical, premodern understanding of prayer. These distortions fail to take seriously that suffering and illness are part of the present reality of this world, and there is not always a demon in every bush.

Why not both? All truth is God's. We need doctors, researchers, scientists, and sensible healthcare. We need the caring love of Christian fellowship. This is tested in times of crisis and stress. But by trusting in these two tried and true realities, we are anchored in any storm. There is always a crisis of one kind or another on the horizon threatening some kind of destructive damage to humanity. Faith is not believing irrationally. It means keeping calm and carrying on with wisdom and understanding. In this way, we will find the way through.


