

TRANSITIONS AT VHBC

At Sunday's business meeting, the church voted unanimously to engage the Center for Healthy Churches (CHC) during our pastoral transition. This will include having Dr. Bill Owen serve as our Transition Pastor. Bill has worked with the CHC for the past six years after a 32-year pastorate at Mt. Carmel Baptist in Cross Plains, Tennessee.



We will greatly benefit from having the experience of a long-time pastor and the skills of a dedicated church consultant working alongside us in the months to come. As we enter this season of spiritual discernment, we can expect God to work in this process just as we have known God's faithfulness through the years. Bill is excited to serve among us and will begin working with our committee leadership in the weeks to come. His first Sunday in the pulpit will be March 14th.



SHEPHERD'S ENCOURAGER DR. GARY FURR



I was so grateful to hear Bill Owen's timely message for all of us on Sunday morning. It was not only helpful for the church but also for Vickie and me. We found ourselves in a time of turbulence and uncertainty as well. In November of 1979, I was 25 years old and was called to be the part-time pastor at Gholson Baptist Church in central Texas, where, as my late beloved father-in-law Forrest put it, "hades is a local call." He was referring to the climate, not the people, who are some of the most wonderful you could ever know.

I had completed four years of college, three years of seminary, and a summer unit of clinical pastoral education at Baylor Medical Center in Dallas. During that summer, I found myself in the front lines of ministry in critical situations, from visiting the psychiatric ward to sitting with people after a loved one had died. I was so excited about ministry and had learned so much. Now I began my ministry in a tiny church in the open country of Texas. The church averaged 27 members attending Sunday school each week, and that number rarely changed.

There was nothing normal about those beginnings in ministry or that church. Jessie Mae Vigus was my minister of music of sorts, the wife of a retired Methodist minister named Frank. Jessie Mae got the job because no one else could read music. A local dairy farmer, Lewis, served as our treasurer. During our business meetings, he would read every expenditure from the previous month, including my salary, the light bill, and anything we had to purchase.

I had also begun to work on my Ph.D. that fall at Baylor University, intending to teach as my vocation. But I was tired, and after the semester ended, I took a year off. I worked in a warehouse shipping dock, loading trucks 40 hours a week, and pastored in every spare minute I had. It was a busy, stressful, turbulent time. I made all sorts of mistakes, I am sure. Being a pastor was hard work but felt as normal and natural to me as breathing. I loved sitting with people who were hurting and needing support. I loved preaching probably more than they did hearing it. I loved being part of a community. My four pastorates have taught me that the oddest and most interesting collection of personalities imaginable fill the church. And that seems to be the way God wants it. Being a pastor taught me that human lives are infinitely interesting, and only by patient study do we come to fully see all that is there.

At the same time, you learn that it is a demanding responsibility and that there are times to come and times to go. It is finally God's church that a shepherd tends, and it belongs finally to God. There is always a danger that we will see ourselves as indispensable. It is not true, of course, but you can still believe it if you are not careful! Fortunately, we all stumbled enough through the years to remember that we never get far from being more than sinners in need of God's grace.

Now I get to test all these things I have come to believe. I am still a pastor by calling, and that does not depend upon a job. I have always believed that, but then again, I have always had a job! There will be important work to do. This is a new season, and I look forward to it.

To every question about what I plan to do, I answer this way right now: When you have plowed a field and planted for so many years, it's important to remember to let it lie fallow for a season before you plant again. My farmers through the years taught me that. If you don't want to turn your life into a Dust Bowl, you better take Sabbath every now and then.

These next 28 days I intend to get a vaccination, move into our into our new place and to have no plan except to celebrate and remember and revel that I have had the privilege to do this all these years, and most of them with you. The next chapter of our lives and our church will be written in their own time. Let's savor these 28 days and one another, and the goodness of God we share.
