### SHEPHERD'S ENCOURAGER DR. GARY FURR



Reinhold Niebuhr was one of the greatest Christian ethicists and theologians of the twentieth century. While many do not know him now, any preacher who has had an education worth anything has read Niebuhr. Several of our Presidents in the past claimed him as an influence. He began his career, though, in a small parish church in Detroit in the 1920s. It was a small congregation, only eighteen families or so, but he ministered among them for thirteen years before leaving for a career of writing and teaching that put him on a larger stage.

At the end of his ministry there, he said, "now that the time has come to sever my connections with the church, I find it almost impossible to do so." (Leaves from the Notebook of a Tamed Cynic) That sentence says it for every pastor who ever truly allows himself or herself to plant down and love a congregation. I have been interviewed for a few articles recently, and one reporter asked me, "What will you miss the most?" My answer was immediate. "The people, especially children."

When you stay a long time, you have held babies in your arms at the hospital, a day old, and then baptized them, loved them, prayed for them, sometimes long enough to officiate at their wedding. You cry with people, you walk in valleys of unimaginable loss, and you celebrate extraordinary success alongside them. It is a most honored privilege to walk along with you. Lillian Daniel and Martin Copenhaver called it "this odd and wondrous calling."

Sometimes people have said, "I don't know how you do it." I understand what they are saying—it is stressful and tiring to be around so much of the hard parts of human lives. This work never ends. Life is a work in progress, and I am just part of that journey for you. Whether sermon, visit, just a sentence or two on a Wednesday night, or at the grocery store in a chance meeting, this work is always on.

It does indeed wear out a human body and mind, but it also is thrilling. Watching people grow spiritually, overcome their worst failure, or step up into leadership is impossible to convey. Even in death and loss, the privilege of stepping into the Holy of Holies with others, in the place where only God can help, is indescribable. People, hands down, are the best part of all.

So why leave it? Well, I can only say one day, you know. It is time that someone like me when I was thirty-eight and walked up here that first Sunday will be called here. That was one of the greatest days of our lives, and we have been blessed beyond every expectation. It is time to step back, redirect, do some other things. You know me enough to realize I will find new chapters of ministry and calling. A church is a precious family, and sometimes you move from parent to grandparent. You can still love the children but raising them is not your job anymore.

This is an emotionally hard time to step aside because of the limits of being together, but we will find ways to see each other and say things. We will continue to belong to this church as it is appropriate and timely to do so. And you have great leaders here. Trust in each other. It is a changing time, and what God has up ahead will be great. This is a wonderful, healthy church.
