


THURSDAY, JUNE 3, 2021

Today we are traveling to a seminary to make some improvements to student housing. This particular housing is reserved for those who cannot afford rent, traveling a long way, or leaving home situations that are less than ideal.

Tonight the church is surprising our group with a water balloon fight with their youth group. I'm excited to see the fun and excitement for both youth groups.

Your prayers for strength, encouragement, and endurance are very much needed. We are doing well thanks to you all and the amazing team of adult leaders we have here.

SATURDAY, JUNE 5, 2021

Yesterday was a great day of work and play! We worked at the largest seminary in Puerto Rico, which is the main theological school in the Caribbean. We were serving in the same place where MLK Jr once gave 2 speeches.

We went on a tour of the First Baptist Church in Puerto Rico and learned how their mission changes by the needs of the community around them, and that their sanctuary is not only a place for worship but the heartbeat of their service for the community.

Lastly we worshipped alongside the youth group of our partner church and we sang songs in English and Spanish. After worship was "Goofy Games Night" where we got to play and be silly with our partner youth group.

Today we are going back to the seminary to finish some facility projects, and there is a slight possibility that we will be going to the beach today.

All is well and good here, thank you for your prayers. We certainly will ask for more!



SUNDAY, JUNE 6, 2021

Yesterday was a wide mixture of experiences for our group. In the morning we served at a place called "The Table of Love". They provide over 150 meals a day to hungry college students from the University of Puerto Rico, along with meeting other basic needs like clothing and other essentials.

Our students were able to get away to the beach for a couple of hours and decompress from all that they have seen and done. We ended the evening with fajitas and salsa dance lessons. To truly serve in Puerto Rico, you have to love the Island and culture of Puerto Rico.

Today we are going to worship alongside our partner church at 10:00 AM (time sound familiar)? The church is fully contemporary and fully in Spanish, I believe our students are going to have a great time experiencing a different expression of worship. After church, we are going to Old San Juan and experience the beauty of the island.

Thank you for your thoughts and prayers, they have been uplifting to us. Each of your kids is doing great, and I am proud of them in so many ways. I have pushed them thus far to grow in their faith, and I believe they are arising to the challenge. Growing in faith is never easy, and seldom feels good at the moment, but in the end, we can do more and experience God in ways that we could have never imagined before.

JUNE 2-9, 2021

MONDAY, JUNE 7, 2021

Today is beach day! After some hard and good work these past few days, we are sleeping in and heading to the beach. We are excited about a day where we can relax and build fellowship together.

Yesterday, we worshipped alongside Iglesia Bautista de Metropolis, and while being a 100% contemporary church, they sang familiar hymns so that we could at least follow along with the tune (if you've never heard How Great Thou Art with a full rock band, you're missing out haha). We spent the rest of yesterday touring the forts and shops of Old San Juan and had dinner with our very own Lucas Dorian, who came down as a representative of Alabama CBF. Iglesia Bautista de Metropolis is also a CBF-affiliated church, so sharing that community has been wonderful!

Thank you so much for your prayers and well wishes for the trip. The students are tired, but good tired, a tiredness that comes from being the hands and feet of Christ. We will be back before you know it, but there's still more work to be done!

Today is the final day! After a day of rest at the beach, and a fun night driving in San Juan, we are excited to serve in our final location, which is on a farm!

The goal for today is to help guide each student towards their own conclusions of how they saw and experienced God on this trip, and what they have learned from this context and apply it to their own spiritual practice and expression of faith in daily life.

That might look like being a spiritual entrepreneur, and seeing needs and gaps in their community, and seeking to fill them for the purpose of showing God's love. That may look like open eyes to all circumstances to see where God is working, even in the most unexpected places.

Your students have done so well this week. They've been kind, polite, and most importantly for this trip, they have been flexible. Plans have changed at the drop of a hat, times in itineraries have at time been loose suggestions, and I each time our students have responded with grace and eagerness to serve. I am proud of them and believe you should be too. We will be home soon!
