CELEBRATION OF FAITHFUL SERVICE THIS SUNDAY!

On Sunday morning, we will air a recording of a special presentation and recognition of Sadra Dudley and Dora Samuel. Sadra has been with us for nearly 49 years. For perspective, your pastor was 17 years old and about to graduate high school when Sadra started working here! She has fed hundreds of preschoolers and prepared--even conservatively calculating, in 49 years—between 2000 and 3000 Wednesday evening suppers, plus banquets, Christmas banquets, funeral luncheons, and special gatherings.

If a church is identified by its spaces, then the sanctuary (Worship and prayer), classrooms (education and discipleship), children and youth spaces (spiritual formation and discipleship), choir room (music and worship) are expressions of who we are. And the great meeting place where fellowship is deepened is the Fellowship Hall. Fellowship means a relationship in Christ. Sadra said to me that what she loved the most were the people of this church, seeing you every week, serving you, asking about your day. She and Dora prayed for you, loved your children, and fed you when you grieved, celebrated anniversaries, hosted receptions for brides and grooms, and fed little ones after Vacation Bible Schools. We owe them a great debt of thanksgiving.

We will honor them with a **drive-by reception time this Sunday from 3-4 pm**, but I want to invite you to **join me in giving to the love offering for Sadra and Dora**. You may give online or a check to the church office. This Sunday will be our moment to thank two helpers who have done so much for us for so long.



REFLECTIONS ON A MOMENT OF CHANGE

Elections are hard-fought, and feelings are strong. We still see deep differences in the United States. But the day after the election, I asked myself, "**What will I do differently today?**" And my answer was, "**I will do the same as every day.**" Ed Stetzer, a professor at Wheaton University, has said recently, "A divided nation needs a united church." The call to the church to faithfully share and live its gospel message is the same.

In this time of differences, there is also the opportunity to see past them to places of connection, of mutual help, of faithful service. Our mission is the same. It is tempting to be pulled away from our primary calling in the chaos of the moment. The hungry still need to be fed, the gospel still needs to be preached, the broken-hearted need to be healed, and the scriptures need to be taught and understood. We still are navigating a pandemic and trying to keep work, church, family, and school going. Stay the course. Jesus reminded us in **Mark 12:29-31**:

Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these."
