CHILDREN'S SABBATH & FALL FEST MADE FOR A WONDERFUL SUNDAY!

On Sunday we came "home." I mean that we returned to in-person worship. We were able to do it safely, following health guidelines and masking, and it was very meaningful. I saw more than a few tears. "Reopening" our society carries tremendous health risks and not only to the elderly. As time goes on, I hear more and more within my circles of sickness and death among families and acquaintances. But we also have learned how to safely navigate it together. Since one thing I learned how to do in graduate work was to read and evaluate research, I have spent as much time as I can to understand the best notions of what can keep our people safe. The truth is, safe distancing and masks **DO** work. They are not perfect, but they are vastly more effective than any other behavior we have available. If both people in a space have masks on while being together, the odds are tremendously decreased. So we know the best things we can do.

We will continue to offer worship, Bible study on Wednesday evenings, and, if necessary, funerals. We will continue to follow the guidelines and to exceed them. It's not giving in to fear. It is intelligent and responsible to care for our flock in this way.







In the afternoon, Nancy, Tyler, and our staff put on an hour and a half of pure fun! The turnout was great, including many of the families from our Child Development Center and some nearby neighbors. Many paused as they drove by where Vickie and I (with help from Eva Kate) waved to folks who came. They thanked me and the church for doing this. Children had fun, families laughed, our deacons presided over the stations, and we had giant cheese puffs, pumpkins, candy, and games—all safe, but there was something else. We forgot about the grimness of this moment for a little while

Our Child Development Center has done an exceptional job of protecting the little ones in our care. And Nancy and all the leaders in the preschool and children's areas of our church have been outstanding in loving, teaching, and protecting our little ones as they share the story of Jesus and the happiness of having a church family with them.

We can do this. **We ARE doing this.** Now, as we have an election next week and head into the more risky fall and winter when we'll be inside more, it is a time not to grow weary with the strain. I know it is tiring, and we want it to be over, but let's keep up our discipline, move-in coordination with the best information out there, and take care of one another.

I am proud of you, church family. Your spirit and love are evident. This will not go on forever, but it will go on for a while yet. So encourage one another and keep up the good work!
