GATHERING RESERVES

The Christian life is a long-distance run, not a sprint. One of the struggles of the Christian life is how to avoid spiritual dryness over the long haul. The early church had to contend with this problem. Born out of the miracle of Easter, empowered by the miracle of Pentecost and energized by the hope of the second coming of Jesus in their lifetimes, early Christians had to begin to come to terms with "what to do when we're in for the long haul."

The setting of the Lord's prayer in Matthew 6 is addressed to this problem. The Jewish Christians to whom Matthew wrote were steeped in Hebrew traditions of prayer. Their problem was not knowing too little but having lost the essence of prayer amid zealous pietism. Jesus reminded them of the need to return once more to the core reality of prayer—attentive conversation with the living God unhindered by human motives and agendas. That is why he counseled "going into your closet" to pray. It was not to say that public prayer is bad, but that prayer is always in danger of being for human listeners rather than the intended Hearer.

The Lord's prayer is a reminder that simple prayer is the best prayer. Eloquence must defer to honesty in prayer. God cannot be impressed, only loved, and honored by our prayers.

This seems doubly important now. Our problems as a society, which erupted into crisis in March, have now moved from crisis into an endurance contest. We are not sprinters - we are marathon runners. As runners know, somewhere in the middle of that long road comes momentary despair. The road ahead stretches beyond our seeing to the end. The road behind already has been too long.

And something in the soul wants to crumple up and quit. It is then that the runner must find something, an invisible next gear, a reserve tank, to go on.

As we move into this fall unlike any we remember, it is time to find some reserve. As we stay together on the run, we offer opportunities for connection, worship, and spiritual sustenance on the long haul of this troubled time. Take note of opportunities for learning, study, fellowship, and worship. There are many smaller options available ahead. It is a time for spiritual discipline, prayer, and encouragement. Get up, keep going, and connect somewhere for deeper living.

I will be offering a five-week class entitled, From the Shadowlands to Hope: Navigating Grief. This class is not meant to be a therapy session, though there are freedom and room to share—none is required. It is not a strict lecture class, but an introduction to information and resources to help us in navigating our way through the hardest of life's journeys-the journey of loss. All who wish to grow in understanding what is happening in the process of grief are welcome to join us. Guest speakers will join me as we try to comprehend what seems impossible to take in-the loss of a loved one. No one is required to share. Limited attendance and signup are required, but I hope some of you will come to join me. Look at the classes offered and sign up for one. We will meet in designated spaces on the property until we are cleared to meet in the building safely again.

Look at the other opportunities listed here and plan to be part of our fellowship in growth and hope this fall. There is a place somewhere for you—safe and distanced. Join us.
