# SHEPHERD'S ENCOURAGER

DR. GARY FURR

I watched some of the news Monday about the outpouring of sorrow for the family of George Floyd. I was very touched by the governor of Texas and his sincere determination to do something for the family and for us all.

I was especially drawn to an interview with a young African American mother in line for the funeral visitation. She started crying when the reporter asked her what she did to help her small children grow up feeling safe amid the pain of the moment. She said the right things, "Teach them what is right, pray over them," but her fear was overwhelming. I thought to myself, "We have to be about caring about each other's children in our country—say it, show it, demand it, and let's make our world demonstrate it. Children, all of them, are God's precious gift. Period. She needs our help."

As God's church, we do not have the luxury of simply having our opinions about it all. We are tied to a story of an unjust death, a suffering Lord, and a gospel of healing and reconciliation. We need to say something right now.

It's hard to know what to say, but saying nothing is a poor choice.

More important is finding a way forward, deliberately, carefully, and allowing time for us all to come along. I will begin a short series of sermons on the prophets of the post-exilic time. They began to sound a vision of hope in an outwardly hopeless time.

On a more concrete level though, I would welcome our church into a conversation about this old wound of race and division and how we might be agents of God's healing in this time. Politics is a tool, but ultimately it is not sufficient for the whole of the problem. It is a spiritual and moral crisis, of which the political is merely a way we express a deeper moral answer.

#### We are unreconciled people.

I want to hold a two-part conversation next Tuesday evening. In a panel discussion moderated by Mike McBrayer, I will join two friends on the question of racial reconciliation.

How do we understand what is happening, and how can we be of help and be effective in building bridges in this moment?

I've invited Dr. CeCelia Walker, who spoke during our Lenten series, and is the Director of Pastoral Care for the Brookwood Baptist Health System. I have also asked Rev. James Fields, a new friend I met in 2019. Rev. Fields is an ex-Marine, who grew up in rural Alabama. He is a Methodist minister, served in the Alabama House of Representatives, and ran for Lieutenant Governor in 2014. I have found him to be a man of conciliatory spirit and Christian love, who is nevertheless honest about the issues before us.

The three of us will have an honest conversation for you to watch. We want you to send questions ahead of time for us to wrestle with. If you have a point of discussion, send it to marthaevhbc.com, and we'll reflect on as many as time allows. The following night, Wednesday, June 17, we'll gather online as a church for a follow-up discussion. I'll ask a couple of members to help me with responding and helping us talk together. This panel discussion will be posted on our Facebook and YouTube pages and is open to anyone. The follow-up discussion will be with our church family.

I hope you will participate. This is a great time to figure it out, reason together, and above all, discern the mind of Christ for the church.

# Permanent Endowment Fund (PEF) Grant Recipients 2020

Due to the generosity of our members, the Permanent Endowment Fund Committee was able to fund \$20,640 in grants for 2020. These grants benefited the Children's Ministry, Library Committee, Missions Committee, Buildings & Grounds Committee, Music Ministry, and the Sound Technology Committee. The total in the Fund as of December 31, 2019 has exceeded \$647,852. These funds will continue to grow and be used for missions, ministries, and capital needs.
