

### UPCOMING SERMON SERIES: WHAT CHRISTIANS CARE ABOUT

If once we were in danger of complacency, we are no more. If anything, we dwell in a moment of hyper vigilance. The problem is that we don't know where to begin in deciding what to care about and what to leave alone. While all of this is heightened by the toxic and inflated rhetoric of an election year, there is truth in our concern.

Even if the fundamentals of our economy are solid, there is uncertainty for any particular person about their job, their future, their prospects in a fast-changing world. A pandemic fills us with uncertainty about health, safety, and protecting those we love. Everywhere we turn, there is conflict, some of it artificially hyped, but much of it real, about the way forward for us all. The environment, racism, morality—we are numb with too much to care about anything.

The danger is that we will check out altogether—stop caring about anything but ourselves. And in the most extreme cases, begin to unravel altogether. It isn't the big things that indicate that someone is shutting down and disconnecting. It's the unmade bed, detachment from friends, letting our habits and disciplines of daily life go that are the telltale signs of a problem—depression, loss of hope, and sometimes self-destructive choices.

We used to sing a little song in that 1970s hymnal called, "Do You Really Care?" For me it was a bit corny musically, but the text asks this important question: "We have the hope and the purpose to share, but do we really care?"

**That**, theologian Douglas John Hall once wrote, is **THE** question for the Christian church. "Do Christians care?" To be a Christian is to care — about what is right, about our responsibilities to God, each other, the world, and the progress of the gospel in the world.

Those who do not follow Christ have the luxury (for now) of not caring about these matters, but we do not.

Caring is, at first glance, a rather boring word, but in truth, it touches the deepest and most significant aspects of our lives. We begin life as those whose very existence and health depends on "being cared for" appropriately.

In 1971, philosopher Milton Mayeroff wrote a sparkling little essay called On Caring. In it, he made the observation that "caring" is not something we do intermittently. Caring and what we care about defines and orders everything in our lives. Find out what someone cares about and you understand everything else they do.

One thing that inspires me in the ministry is to see how much church people care about their church, its ministries, and its causes in the world. How they love and care for one another. How they care about their community and their world. We couldn't make it otherwise.
