





WORDS FROM DIETRICK BONHOEFFER FOR LENT

First, we must completely forget how to say, "I will," until God, through the Holy Spirit, teaches us to say it in a new and right way. It is precisely in matters of piety that "I will" can wreak the greatest havoc: "I will be godly, I will be holy, I will keep the commandments." We must first have a basic understanding that in these things, it is not our will but God's will alone that matters. We must also forgo our pious self, so that God can do his work in us. Otherwise our "I will" will almost certainly be followed by bankruptcy. But when through God's grace we have stopped saying, "I will," when through God's new beginning with us in Jesus Christ we have been brought onto his path - in spite of our "I will" and "I won't" - then the Holy Spirit begins to speak in us, we say something guite new and different from our previous "I will."

PASTOR'S ARTICLE

Over the last year, we have focused the ministry of our church on our theme of ANEW. We celebrated Discipleship ANEW in the Fall, Worship ANEW during Advent, and Fellowship ANEW during Epiphany. During Lent, we are focused on Mission ANEW.

While our methods of missions have evolved over the decades, the mission of God has remained the same since the beginning of scripture. God's mission begins at the beginning. In the shadow of the betrayal of the garden in Genesis 3, God calls Abram in Genesis 12 to both receive a blessing and to be a blessing to the people of the world. God's mission is woven throughout the rest of scripture. Jesus comes to fulfill God's purpose and reconcile humanity with our Creator. Jesus then sends his followers into the world as agents of this reconciliation and his kingdom.

Church history is filled with stories of how individuals and churches have struggled to understand and fulfill this divine mission. Beginning in the late 1700's in England, a new missionary movement emerged among Baptists and other protestants. With the world open to travel, individuals traveled to difficult places on earth to bear witness to the life and light of Jesus Christ.

One of my favorite missionaries during this time was Adoniram Judson and his wife, Ann. The Judsons traveled to Burma in 1812, sent by the Congregational Church of new England. By the time they arrived they switched to being Baptists. When Adoniram died in 1850, he had spent 37 years abroad introducing Jesus to the Karen people of Burma. Over the past few decades many of the Karen people have been forced out of their country arriving in the states as refugees. They have sought out Baptist churches because the faith they received from the Judson's continues through today. They are now leading churches which once sent missionaries to serve them.

One of my favorite missionaries during this time was Adoniram Judson and his wife, Ann. The Judsons traveled to Burma in 1812, sent by the Congregational Church of new England. By the time they arrived they switched to being Baptists. When Adoniram died in 1850, he had spent 37 years abroad introducing Jesus to the Karen people of Burma. They have sought out Baptist churches because the faith they received from the Judson's continues through today. They are now leading churches which once sent missionaries to serve them.

Mission ANEW invites to see the story of God's mission at work in the world today. Mission is evangelism, community service, faith-based community development, radical hospitality, good news sharing and much more. It happens in Vestavia Hills and in Matagalpa, Nicaragua; in Lucenec, Slovakia and the Westside of Birmingham. Whenever we engage in mission we are engaging in God's work in that place.

In April, we will experience Spring Serve ANEW on Sunday, April 23. In an effort to invite each sacred partner of VHBC to engage God's Mission we will connect worship and mission. On that day, we will worship together, eat together and serve together. There will be an opportunity for each person - regardless of age and ability - to learn about mission and serve in God's Kingdom. There will opportunities at the church and opportunities in the community. Let me encourage you to make all efforts to participate in this fun, impactful day of service. You will meet new people and try new things and be encouraged by the mission of God.

Until then, I hope you will join me on Wednesday nights as we study Mission ANEW and look at what it means today to be on mission with God in the world.
